JOB PURPOSE:

To teach at undergraduate level in the Subject Area of Spanish, contributing both to language and research-led contextual studies modules. To contribute to Subject Area and School administration/outreach activity.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Teaching:

- 1. Design and deliver teaching and assessment activities for research-led contextual studies modules including lectures, seminars, setting/marking coursework.
- 2. Contribute to the design and delivery of research-led, team-taught modules, including lectures, setting/marking coursework.
- 3. Contribute to Spanish language classes including delivery of text-based classes (translation and composition), overseeing the grammar workshop, setting/marking coursework and exams, and updating of materials as required.
- 4. Undertake the role of year abroad coordinator for Spanish responsible for the administration of the year abroad module SPA3050 and preparing Level 2 students to go abroad in 2021/2 including overseeing applications to partner institutions and to the British Council.
- 5. Oversee the 'virtual year abroad' experience including designing a series of worksheet based activities for a "virtual year abroad" suitable for online learning and coordinating oral classes.
- 6. Select appropriate assessment instruments and criteria, assess the work and progress of students by reference to the criteria and provide constructive feedback to students.
- 7. Seek ways of improving performance by reflecting on teaching design and delivery and obtaining and analysing feedback.
- 8. Plan and develop independent teaching contributions and contribute to the design or revision of course units.
- 9. Develop appropriate teaching approaches and contribute to curriculum development.

Scholarly Activity:

- 1. Engage in scholarly activity e.g. participate in conferences, external funding applied for, book reviews and teaching/professional materials published.
- 2. Develop networking links with relevant professional bodies to ensure that own teaching reflects current best practice in own area of subject specialism.
- 3. Maintain and develop teaching and subject expertise.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

- 1. Contribute to the School's outreach/internationalisation strategy by developing external links.
- 2. Provide pastoral care for students within own area to ensure, as far as practicable, that relevant issues are dealt with in a timely, sympathetic and effective manner.
- 3. Carry out designated routine School administrative duties, including, for example, committee work, course administration, etc.
- 4. Be responsible for the record–keeping associated with teaching and the preparation of teaching materials.

Planning and Organising:

- 1. Plan and manage own teaching and tutorials as agreed with Head of School/Subject Lead.
- 2. Design/update modules in line with in line with subject's requirements and School's teaching strategy.

3. Deliver modules online to a high standard and using appropriate software and technology to enhance delivery.

Resource Management Responsibilities:

- 1. Use teaching resources, laboratories and workshops as required.
- 2. Co-ordinate activities of teaching assistants at Level 2 and as part of the virtual year abroad as required.

Internal and External Relationships:

- 1. Membership of the Spanish and Portuguese Subject Board, Examination Board, School Board such committees relevant to their administrative duties.
- 2. Collaborate with other staff within School.
- 3. Involved in developing links or joining external networks to share information and ideas.
- 4. Contribute to the School's internationalisation programme by maintaining and establishing links with partner institutions in Spain and with the British Council.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

- 1. Have or be about to obtain a PhD in a relevant field of Spanish or Spanish-American Studies.
- 2. Teaching experience delivering Spanish language classes at third level.
- 3. Teaching experience delivering relevant contextual / research-led teaching at third level.
- 4. Ability to design course materials and to plan and organise the delivery and assessment of taught courses in own specialism.
- 5. Familiarity and/or experience with online teaching methods and delivery.
- 6. Ability to contribute fully to the broader administrative activities of the subject area and the School of Arts, English and Languages.
- 7. Native or near native fluency in Spanish. Native speakers of Spanish should have near native fluency in English.
- 8. Must demonstrate ability to communicate complex information clearly.
- 9. Must demonstrate high level of analytical capability.
- 10. Must demonstrate balanced judgement.
- 11. Must demonstrate ability to encourage commitment to learn in others.
- 12. Ability to work as part of a team.
- 13. Effective interpersonal skills to liaise with students and colleagues.
- 14. Ability and willingness to engage in cross-School activities.

DESIRABLE CRITERIA:

1. Expertise in literary/cultural/film studies and in post 1800 peninsular Spanish studies.
